What is the Student Research Award?

The Academy appreciates those students who have shown valiant effort and talent in the area of research. Promoting the science of audiology through continuous research is a significant contribution to the growth of our profession. Each university selects one student at their discretion who has pursued this endeavor with exceptionalism. The student will be invited to present their research at the convention on (usually on a Saturday) and be awarded a \$100.00 honorarium.

Can the students selected for this award attend the Annual FLAA Convention?

YES! Students are highly encouraged to attend the annual convention. There is no special convention rate for a student who is nominated for the Student Research Forum award because they receive the \$100 honorarium. See below for more information.

What is the procedure to register?

To get started, the Student must first complete a membership application, as a FREE Student Member. The application can be found online at www.floridaaudiology.org. Once the application is submitted, a membership username and password will be issued via e-mail. This username and password will be needed to complete the online convention registration form.

After the membership application is completed, the Student should complete the online Student Convention registration form, which can be found at www.floridaaudiology.org.

What does it cost for a Student to attend the Convention?

There are three options from which Students can choose for attending the convention. The rate(s) vary depending upon the choice.

Option 1

Attend the full convention as a paid registration at the Student Member rate of \$150.

Option 2

Attend the full convention FREE by volunteering at least 4 hours during the convention.

Option 3

Attend ONLY the Student Research Forum. This option does NOT allow for attendance at any convention sessions.

What if I want to attend just on Saturday?

At this time students who want to attend for one day only still have to volunteer for the four hours.
